-how about the lottery?

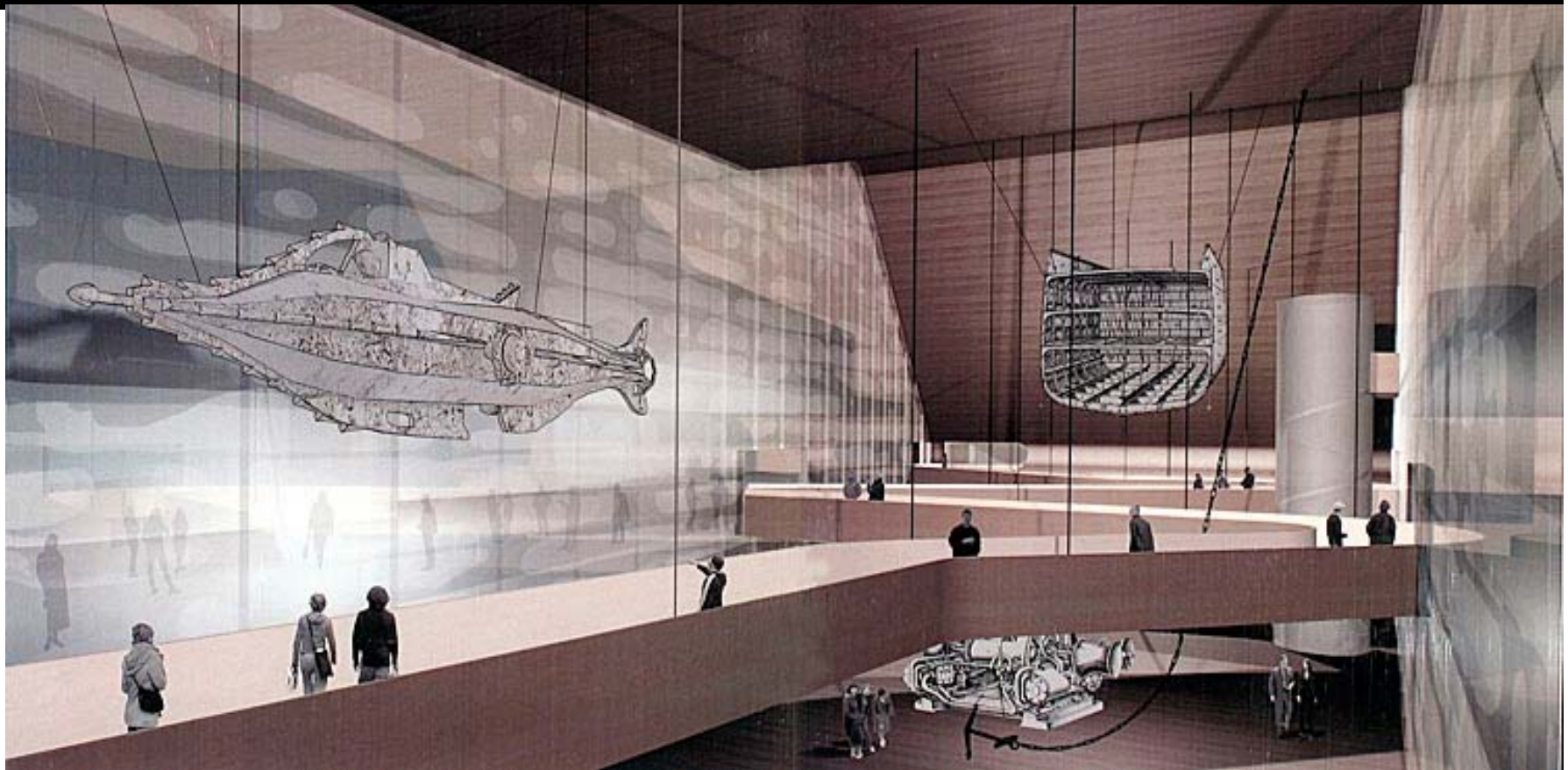


How to Achieve Good Results and Avoid Waste of Resources
